

ine and a half years ago, Antarctic Press produced its first anthology title, Mangazine. The book has undergone many changes since then: different sizes, different cover stock, different interior paper, different page counts, changes from bimonthly to quarterly back to bimonthly to monthly publishing status . . . and finally, the addition and growing importance of the anime section. Throughout all of this change, though, Mangazine has remained a proving ground for new creators. By providing a forum for untried artists, the book allowed us to take chances we couldn't otherwise have afforded. Often, these chances have paid off, leading to full series like Joe Wight's Twilight X and Fred Perry's Gold Digger.

But in the near future, probably by Mangazine #36 or 37, that's going to change. The comics section, which has dwindled to a bare third of the book, will disappear, making room for more of the articles and reviews that have become the heart of the publication.

If I wanted to wallow in melancholy wistfulness, I might say it marks the end of an era, that things will never quite be the same, or that all steps into the future require the abandonment of something from the past.

The truth is, though, that we're lopping an extra thumb off the book, and it will probably work lots better without it.

So where does that leave all the aspiring new artists who previously looked, starry-eyed, to Mangazine with all their hopes of being published, of getting that foot in the comics industry's door? Are we leaving them completely out in the cold? Well, in a manner of speaking, we are.

Absolute Zero is the coldest possible temperature, the temperature at which all subatomic motion comes to a halt. It's also the name of Antarctic's new anthology title, set to debut late this year or early next. We chose the name because it's in keeping with our general south pole motif, it has a nice ring of magnitude to it . . . and it will make any hostile critics happy because it's sort of like painting a big target on our chests.

The book is now open for submissions - any and all genres are accepted, so long as they don't require an "adults only" label. It will be a big book — 48 pages — so there will be lots of room for fresh new talent. We're pretty excited about it. We hope you will







































































































































































Its been a looning time since issue #4.
